

**Dear Minister of Education [minister's name here],**

As you are likely aware, Demetrios Nicolaidis, Minister of Education and Childcare in Alberta, with the support of the Alberta Government, is addressing the issue of **suggestive and instructional, lewd pornographic books present in Canadian K-12 schools**. He has put forth efforts toward “a consistent provincewide standard for school boards when selecting age-appropriate school library materials”. I am writing today to urge you to take similar action to restore and protect the innocence, safety, and dignity of children and adolescents in [province/territory]. I have CC'd Premier [premier's name] on this letter calling for urgent action.

The May 26, 2025 release of “[Ensuring age-appropriate books in school libraries](#)” includes a link to reference materials with drawn images of extreme sexual acts and written dialogue about lewd sex acts and inappropriate (and illegal) sexual relationships, as well as suggestive and self-deprecating ideas and themes. We warn you of the extreme content in the reference materials, should you, by due diligence, view some of the books that may be available to minors in some of [province/territory]’s K-12 school libraries. There is no excuse for sexualized and otherwise suggestive materials in K-12 schools in Canada. Our hope is that this long-overdue action being taken in Alberta will inspire [province/territory] to promptly follow suit. Should you and your team not address the issue, one would have to ask, why not?

It is our duty on behalf of [province/territory]’s children and adolescents to urge you and your team to take immediate action on this issue. It is yours to do so.
